INTRODUCTION

TPO Foundation worked on its three key programmes: ELLI (Education, Learning and Living), PaR (Peace building and Reconciliation) and LIFE (Leadership for Equality) in 2015.

The implementation of the project “Psychosocial Support in B&H” was continued in the flooded areas of Eastern and Northern B&H and within its framework we have begun a research on trauma and violence against children, young people and women. Floods that occurred in B&H have somewhat directed a part of our activities by which we wanted to show care and solidarity in the local communities that were neglected, particularly small rural areas. Since the greatest concern of the majority of donors and organizations was remediation of the material damage, TPO Foundation decided to pay attention more to the psychosocial programmes with young people and engage volunteers from the University of Tuzla to work with children.

The second part of activities was related to LIFE Programme-leadership of young people and women. Through the new and educational contents in the form of comics, stories, essays and exhibitions we tried to encourage young people to engage themselves in leadership. All these activities were permeated with the idea of gender equality which is the integral frame of all programme contents. Beside this, the great research “Gender and Leadership in Politics and Business”, whose results will be presented in the book by the end of 2016, is completed.

The third part of the programme included the implementation of learning on ethical values. A part of that programme is the project “Global Ethics in B&H Schools” that we began in 2013. Cooperation with Ministries of Education in several cantons proved to be fruitful and we managed to educate over 200 teachers. The web portal etos.ba was launched and it will be used by teachers to put and exchange teaching contents and learn from each other. The summer camp for children was also supported and the comics were distributed to them.

Every year TPO Foundation commemorates traditionally the International Women’s Day and 16 Days of Activism against Gender based Violence with apposite activities.

ABOUT US

TPO Foundation mission is contribution to development of democratic civil society, increased awareness on gender equality, establishment of partnership ethics and promotion of accountability and responsibility in family, society and political life in BH, via implementation of educational, research, psychosocial and intercultural program activities.

TPO Foundation was developed from HNI TPO organisation network with headquarters in Amsterdam , present in BH from 1998, implementing projects in the filed of psychosocial care, education and reconciliation and dialogue among returnees population. Since 2004, by HNI TPO Amsterdam decision, local team in BH works as and independent nongovernmental organisation under the name of TPO Foundation, however, formal registration was completed in 2006.

During 2004, TPO Foundation as a local organisation, directed its activities toward educational and research projects in cooperation with BH, European and USA universities.

Mission realization

Education - Cooperation with universities and other organisations in implementing BiH education reform. Establishment of education centres in cooperation with educational and cultural institutions offering programs for intercultural, multi-religious and civic education, predominantly for women and youth. Preparation of curricula, syllabi, and training materials in cooperation with state institutions and other organisations.


Research - Assessments in the field of education, human rights, gender equality, dialogue, and peace building with the purpose of preparing adequate policies and specific project activities, always taking into consideration gender perspective and specificities of the cultural context.

Gender equality - Promotion and implementation of local and international standards on gender equality through various types of education and raising awareness about these issues in local communities. Special focus is on development of local gender-inclusive communities that respond to the needs of both women and men.

Public Advocacy - Advocacy for changes in action policies and adoption of new policies with the aim of developing a democratic civil society and gender equality, but also raising awareness of the society about the importance of active involvement and participation of citizens in decision making processes. Advocating for gender sensitisation of BiH legislation.

Capacity Building - Empowering individual capacities of women and youth, as well as organizational capacities of local organizations, in areas of gender equality, human rights, economic empowerment, dialogue, and peace building. Support to education reform, health care, and social rehabilitation by training professionals and promoting user's initiatives, and providing psychosocial support to women, children, and youth.

Intercultural Dialogue - Promotion of intercultural dialogue, peace building, and reconciliation in cooperation with relevant NGOs, both national and international. Organization of public debates, round tables, and workshops, as well as meetings of artists, academics, and NGO activists capable of providing respective solutions for common action and co-existence. Organisation of meetings in small local communities with the aim of gathering representatives of divided communities in BiH and opening a dialogue.




MAIN OUTCOMES

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

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I PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT IN BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA



Activity 1 Presentations of the Handbook “Living on the Landslide”

Within the project “Psychosocial Support in Bosnia and Herzegovina”, TPO Foundation and the University of Tuzla contribute, through education and preparation of educational materials, in solving the problems to which the population affected by floods in B&H is exposed.

One of the segments of the project was the issuance and presentation of the handbook “Living on the Landslide”, which tackles the issue of implementation of preventive measures, which are caused by floods in May 2014, and the landslide stabilization. The authors of the manual are Rejhana Dervišević, PhD and Zijad Ferhatbegović, PhD.

On February 4, 2015, TPO Foundation organized in Srebrenik the presentation of the handbook for the public, representatives of local communities and representatives of the Municipality of Srebrenik. The citizens, by participating actively in a conversation with the authors of the handbook, exchanged their personal experiences regarding the problems of the landslides and got instructions and tips on how to recognize the landslides, and repair them temporarily.

The second presentation of the handbook for the citizens and representatives of local communities of the Municipality Gradačac in Gradačac was held on March 17, 2015. During the presentation the authors pointed out to the mechanisms of landslides and the causes which contribute to the initiation of earth masses, as well as measures taken to prevent and eliminate the damage.



Activity 2 Two-Day Trainings for Volunteers

Within the project “Psychosocial support in B&H” TPO Foundation started realization of three trainings for volunteers. The workshops are aimed to assess the psychological state of children and youth who have suffered damage after last year's floods and to provide assistance through psychosocial workshops and interactive meetings. During the trainings it was concluded that the volunteers and helpers need to determine the needs and methods that will be used in work with children and young people in flooded areas. The participants were instructed how to establish a conversation with children and their parents and creative ways to interact with them. Lecture was concluded that B&H is still in a difficult transitional situation and that people affected by various traumatizing events need psychosocial support to overcome the trauma and to develop a healthier environment, and that there is a great need to establish a Volunteer Centre, which will primarily organize trainings and educational programs for the volunteers who will be prepared to assist in various crisis situations.



The first two - day training of the three planned trainings was held in Tuzla on April 11-12, 2015. Participants were students of the final years of the Medical Faculty of the University of Tuzla.

The second two-day training of volunteers of the Union of Students in Tuzla was held on April 25 - 26, 2015. The training participants (19 volunteers) were students of the Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation and the Faculty

of Philosophy in Tuzla.

The third two-day training of volunteers of the Union of Students in Tuzla was held on May 9 -



10, 2015. The training participants (32 volunteers) are students of the Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation, the Faculty of Philosophy and the Faculty of Natural Sciences and Mathematics. Young volunteers come from the Bosnian-Herzegovinian cities - Derventa, Modriča, Teočak, Gornji Vakuf-Uskoplje, Maglaj, Doboj Istok, Zavidovići, Tuzla, Kalesija, Ljubuški, Živinice, Gradačac, Gračanica, Srebrenik, Mostar, Brčko, Doboj, and from Croatian cities – Rijeka and

Vukovar.

All trainings were led by Dr. Amra Delić, the neuropsychiatrist and psychotherapist from Tuzla, an activist in the field of human rights, dialogue and reconciliation and assisted by Irma Ramić, a representative of the Student Union of Medical Faculty in Tuzla.



Activity 3 Workshops for children from the flood affected areas in B&H

Within the project “Psychosocial support in B&H” in April 2015, volunteers from Student Union of the University of Tuzla Ena Alibegović and Monika Stojak in cooperation with TPO Foundation held the first workshop in Donja Obodnica, Tuzla. The workshop was attended by 17 children of different ages: pre-school, school, and one member of the Higher Education.

Volunteers – students of the Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation and the Faculty of Philosophy in Tuzla (Volunteers of the Union of Students of the University of Tuzla) – in cooperation with TPO Foundation realizing the Project “Psychosocial support in B&H” implemented series of workshops for children and youth from Tuzla Canton in Donja Obodnica, Stanić Rijeka - Doboj Istok and Kikači - Kalesija. Seven organized workshops brought together 113 children aged 6-15 years. Fourteen volunteers participate in the preparation and implementation of these workshops. Twelve trained volunteers of the Union of Students of the University of Tuzla – Elma Mujčinović, Edin Mujčinović, Edin Čerkezović, Emir Brzović, Elmira Begić, Almir Halilović, Eldina Mahmuzić, Alisa Mujanović, Dajana Nakić, Anita Pejić, Marina Supuković and Asmir Smajlović – in cooperation with TPO Foundation held six workshops in the elementary school Klokotnica, Stanić Rijeka, the Municipality of Doboj

Istok during April 2015. The workshop was attended by 76 school children from 1st to 4th grade.



Parents of children were present at the beginning to get acquainted with the volunteers and the content of the activities. Children had the opportunity to get familiar, and then through a drawing represent their families. Older students and students talked through their drawings about traumatic experiences they remember regarding flooding, displacement from their homes and more. These were rare occasions on which children had an opportunity to talk and think about the abovementioned themes, so they accepted the work and cooperation with volunteers delightfully.



Activity 4 Presentations and activities of 15 partner mental health associations in B&H

Within the project “Psychosocial Support in Bosnia and Herzegovina” TPO Foundation has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with XY Association/Mental Health Project in Bosnia and Herzegovina which aims to implement programs to empower services for mental health associations’ users. The goal of the program was to establish a partnership association with young professionals in the field of psychosocial care at the local level which has to provide administrative and educational support. This initiative provided greater availability of psychosocial support in the field of mental health. The project was covered by associations and users in 15 cities/ associations in Bosnia and Herzegovina: “Zajedno” Banja Luka, “Svi” Bosanski Petrovac, “Ruka ruci” Brčko, “Nada” Doboј, “Tunel” Ključ, “Nisi sam” Milići, “In Spe” Mostar, “U zdravlje” Mrkonjić Grad, “Apel” Sanski Most, “Mensanna” Sarajevo, “Podijeli osmjeh” Srebrenica, “Sonata” Trebinje, “Naš glas” Tuzla, “Stella” Zenica and “Zvono” Zvornik. During 2014 and 2015 all these mentioned associations implemented numerous activities and exhibitions. All activities and workshops where organized according to the methodology of the occupational-work therapy.




II COMMEMORATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY



Activity 1 Exhibition “NIČIJA ZEMLJA”, the revolutionary writer and poetess Vera Obrenović-Delibašić

On March 8, TPO Foundation in cooperation with the Museum of Literature and Theatre Arts of B&H opened an exhibition entitled “No Man's Land” (originally “Ničija zemlja”), dedicated to the revolutionary writer and poetess Vera Obrenović-Delibašić. This writer and poetess left a significant mark on the B&H cultural heritage dealing with the engaged art through literature in the era of World War II when engaged art was considered and recognized as a man's job. The exhibition was opened by the director of the Museum and exhibition author Šejla Šehabović, author Zlatan Delić and project coordinator of TPO Foundation Monja Šuta-Hibert. The exhibition lasted five days and was accompanied by educational programs for youth “Open Classroom”.

Activity 2 Open classroom for youth: “Violence against Girls and Women - Prevention and Responsibilities”

Within five days of the exhibition “Ničija zemlja” dedicated to the poetess Vera Obrenović-Delibašić at the Museum of Literature and Theatre Arts of Bosnia and Herzegovina, TPO Foundation implemented open classroom for young people entitled “Violence against Girls and Women - Prevention and Responsibilities”. Guests of the open classrooms were members of the Youth Council of Novo Sarajevo and students of higher grades of elementary school “Džemaludin Čaušević”. Lecturer of this open classroom was Arijana Ćatović, the psychotherapist. Before they started a discussion on the topic, attendees had the opportunity to see artistic performance entitled “Presijeci” (“Cut”), which was carried out by young actresses of Academy of Performing Arts Sarajevo. The aim of the performance was to introduce various forms of violence against women through body language and music, and to send a message that we are all obliged to react to any form of violence and to work to prevent it in society. Ćatović presented violence as a way of taking power and is primarily emotional violence which causes psychological, physical, sexual, and economic and any other violence. Violence against women in various forms is most present in our community. In cases between men and women, violence begins with sweet words, excessive attention and kindness, then it grows into inspection, testing, criticism, followed by the violence that is difficult to treat. The conclusions of this open classroom were that each person should be aware that he or she may become a victim of one or more forms of violence. Identification and recognition of any form of violence will help solve the problem and protect from experiencing further violent behavior and that every person should be aware that he or she has the right and opportunity to break the cycle of violent behavior and that we are all required to help people suffering from violence.

Activity 3 Open classroom for young people with UN Women representative

Within celebration of the International Women's Day, on March 12, 2015 TPO Foundation in cooperation with Museum of Literature and Theatre Arts of Bosnia and Herzegovina implemented an open classroom whose guests were second grade students of IB Middle Years Programme of Second Gymnasium Sarajevo, while the lecturer was a representative of the Agency of the United Nations for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women in B&H, Anne-Marie Esper Larsen. Moderator of open classroom and project coordinator Melika Šahinović welcomed the attendees and introduced the programs of TPO Foundation and activities within the International Women's Day to them. Esper Larsen presented the importance of UN Security Council Resolution 1325 - Women, Peace and Security and reflected it on the position of women in Bosnia and Herzegovina who are, in addition to the horrible suffering that they experienced during the war, still in difficult economic and social position. Esper Larsen stressed systematic rape, which the UN Resolution 1325, after the events in Bosnia and Herzegovina and Rwanda, has been included in the international criminal law as one of the most serious war crimes. After the introduction to the topic, discussion was opened with students who shared their opinions on the topics of political, economic, and social participation of women in our society, stereotypes and barriers women are faced with. Some felt that women should be more united and fight for their goals while others believed that enough space for acting of women in society is still not allowed and a variety of activities and initiatives that support the empowerment of women are of great need.

Activity 4 Open classroom for young people with the director of the Museum of Literature and Theatre Arts of Bosnia and Herzegovina

On March 9, 2015 the Open Classroom themed “The Literary Canon for Beginners” was held with the pupils of the Primary school “Safvet bey Bašagić”. The lecturer was Šejla Šehabović, a director of the “Museum of Literature and Theatre Art of B&H” and they discussed the invisibility of the female writers in BH literature on this very occasion.



III CREATIVE WORKSHOPS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE AND PROMOTION OF THE COMIC BOOK NIRA



Activity 1 Seven (7) interactive educational “Nira” workshops



Within the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education ICDE, TPO Foundation hired two comic designers: Filip Andronik and Esmir Prlja and two text authors: Elma Softić-Kaunitz and Pavle Kaunitz who wrote ten (10) stories for comic book “Nira”. After the first promotions in December 2014, TPO Foundation continued to promote and use comic book “Nira” for educational purposes in March 2015.



As a part of a joint initiative of TPO Foundation and the Museum of Literature and Theatre Arts of Bosnia and Herzegovina, TPO Foundation provided its entire March activities focusing on different educational programs aiming at young people from Bosnia and Herzegovina.



These educational programs were addressed not only to the basic principles of human rights and civic activism, but were also related to the position of young girls and women and gender equality in general. Therefore, the TPO Foundation visited numerous high schools, training centers and public libraries across the country where TPO team realized seven (7) workshops for groups of 15-20 pupils (first and second grades of high school).



The aim of the workshop was to, through creative exercises and participatory practices, encourage young people not only to think about the issues related to civic activism, volunteerism and human rights but also on alternative forms of critical thinking and articulation. In this regard, during these workshops was also held the promotion of the comic book "Nira" and its use for educational purposes was a unique opportunity for all the participants and guests to get acquainted not only with the comic book "Nira" but also with the art of comic in general and through creative practices review responsibility own actions towards self and others.



The seven (7) mentioned workshops were held at the following schools and institutions: City Library in Kakanj, High School "Edhem Mulabdić" in Maglaj, Youth Centre "Centar" in Mrkonjić Grad in Republic of Srpska, Centre for Culture and Information – National Library in Srebrenik, Elementary School "Novi Šeher" in Novi Šeher, Elementary School "Srednje" in Srednje and the Elementary School "Podlugovi" in Podlugovi. This seven (7) workshops resulted in participation of more than one hundred and twelve (112) young participants.





Association “Another Angle” (original name: “Drugi ugao”) unveiled latest comic production available in B&H and beyond at the STRIPITI Fest. This year (July 2015) at STRIPITI Fest, TPO Foundation presented the comic book NIRA and Bauk FemiNauk edition with more than 20 comics. The coordinator of the ICDE project, Melika Šahinović, among other exhibitors of traditional and innovative comics, presented activities of the foundation and two years work on the comic books as a form of expression that communicates

different messages intertwined with images and words that encourage learning, reflection and work and combine creativity and civic activism. The text authors Elma Softić-Kaunitz and Pavle Kaunitz presented the idea of creating a heroine Nira and two-year work on ten comic stories of Nira. Bauk FemiNauk is presented through two editions of 2014 and 2015, which, through humorous comic situations, makes people question prejudices about feminism, gender equality and position of women in contemporary BH society.

TPO Foundation presented the future plans to the public, which primarily refers to the second issue of the comic book novel NIRA, a book on stories of heroine Nira, continuation of work on the second edition of the comic Bauk FemiNauk and publication of columns on gender equality stereotypes. Exhibition of comics was held also at the National Art Gallery of Bosnia and Herzegovina. After that, Filip Andronik and Neven Misaljević gave interviews in Serbia and Macedonia about NIRA comic book novel.



V WRITING, DESIGNING AND PUBLISHING OF TEN (10) NEW EDITIONS BOGEY FEMITEACHING STORIES (BAUK FEMINAUK)



Within the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education (ICDE) TPO Foundation produced two editions of Bogey FemiTeaching created in 2014 and in September 2015. The Bogey FemiTeaching stories represent the life situations within which feminist activists, and all those who do not share the identity publicly, expressing or advocating for gender equality, face every day. We strongly believe that critical questioning of gender politics norms in a society, through this

kind of media, can and will help make a more realistic approach to the issue of discrimination, oppression and exclusion.

VI WRITING, DESIGNING AND PUBLISHING OF THE COMIC BOOK NIRA 2 AND A COLLECTION OF SHORT STORIES “NIRA’S CHALLENGES”



After the first edition of the comic book novel “Nira”, TPO Foundation continued cooperation with authors Elma Softić-Kaunitz and Pavle Kaunitz, and the final result of it was a publishing of a comic book “Nira” and a collection of short stories “Nira’s Challenges”. The aim of these publications is to motivate and encourage young people to learn creatively, read, reflect, act properly and be active participants of the community in which they live with the message that every

individual has rights and obligations to be active in the development of democratic civil society and help to protect and promote human rights.

VII WRITING, EDITING AND DESIGNING OF THE BOOK “GENDER STEREOTYPES: SOUNDS FAMILIAR?” WITHIN BOGEY FEMITEACHING EDITION



The book “Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?” was born within the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education (ICDE) implemented by TPO Foundation Sarajevo. The book was edited by Monja Šuta-Hibert and the review was written by Ms. Radmila Rangelov-Jusović and Professor Damir Kukić. The book is a collection of

essays written by various authors who deal with gender equality in various segments of life, prejudices on feminism and position of women in contemporary B&H society. It represents a unique combination of so called educational comics with short thematic texts that discuss several gender and feminist issues and aspects closely related to education, patriarchal and family values, law, science, religion, politics, media and other numerous gender based discriminatory practices. A lodestar through the whole process was the fact that they who knew very little about feminism were usually the fiercest critics and that those who were the loudest claimed they had never been the slaves of gender stereotypes and prejudices repeated the same thing on a daily basis. It should be emphasized that this very book represents one of the shifts taken on the daily basis in order to reach a wider circle of people and to work on raising awareness and breaking of deeply rooted prejudices. Beside mentioned activities TPO Foundation also made animation of 5 comics from the "Bogey FemiTeaching" edition. We intend to make more and this audiovisual material will be used for educational purposes and promotion of the gender equality concept.

VIII A GLOBAL ETHIC IN A SCHOOL: INTEGRATING A GLOBAL ETHIC INTO EDUCATIONAL STRUCTURES AND PROCESSES IN BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA



Activity 1 Research modules required for the delivery of training for teachers as well as the selection and counseling future trainers and the moderators

In order to implement the workshops professionally as much is possible, and to deliver to the workshops' participants better insight into the specificity of the proposed methodology, it was decided that the first project facilitators will be: Mr. Alen Kristić (in charge of the theoretical aspect of the workshop)

Ms. Monja Šuta-Hibert (in charge of methodology and audio-visual materials) and Ms. Sedžida Hadžić (in charge of methodology and working plan in bh. schools). In this sense, facilitators managed to create a very successful teaching module that included aspects such as: Training objectives; "A Global Ethic: Rules of the Globalized World"; "A Global Ethic as a Pedagogical Project"; "A Global Ethic – Jewish, Christian, Islamic and Philosophical Foundation"; "A Global Ethic in B&H – Contextualization and Application", as well as guidelines and demonstration of a number of school classes and thematic units covered by the manual "A Global Ethic Under the School Roof".



The third workshop was held on May 30 - 31, 2015 for teachers from Sarajevo Canton. The workshop was attended by a total of twenty (20) participants from ten (10) secondary schools. In this workshop dominated teachers who teach confessional religious education, culture of religion, democracy and human rights as well as English.



The fourth workshop was held on June 13 - 14, 2015 for teachers from Sarajevo Canton. The workshop was attended by twenty three (23) participants from fourteen (14) high schools. In this workshop dominated teachers who teach confessional religious education, culture of religion, democracy and human rights as well as English and history.



The fifth workshop was held on September 12 - 13, 2015 for teachers from Tuzla Canton. The workshop was attended by twenty four (24) participants from twelve (12) high schools.



The sixth workshop was held on October 03 - 04, 2015 for teachers from Tuzla Canton. The workshop was attended by twenty two (22) participants from sixteen (16) high schools.



The seventh workshop was held on October 10 - 11, 2015 for teachers from Tuzla Canton. The workshop was attended by twenty five (25) participants from fourteen (14) high schools.



The eighth workshop was held on October 24 - 25, 2015 for teachers from Tuzla Canton. The workshop was attended by twenty two (22) participants from seventeen (17) high schools.

IX WRITING, DESIGNING AND PUBLISHING OF THE MANUAL SELF-BRANDING FOR YOUTH AND WORKSHOPS FOR YOUTH



In order to encourage young people to participate actively in the public life of the community and improve the quality of life, and to provide support to young people in developing their knowledge, skills and attitudes to be able to adapt to market demands, the research team of TPO Foundation Sarajevo conducted needs' analysis for youth during 2014 within the framework of the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education. Based on the views and needs of young people related to leadership, communication, employment and work, position in society, and other issues of importance to young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina, we conducted a manual entitled "Personal and Professional Development - Manual for Youth". This manual is a product of our wishes to contribute and to support the youth to extend their professional development in their acquired knowledge, and develop and strengthen their potential, skills and competencies to become useful and productive members of society.

Activity 1 Two-day training for youth "Personal and Professional Development" in Sarajevo

Regarding needs of young people within the project ICDE, TPO Foundation organized the first two-day training for young people in Sarajevo on May 30 - 31, 2015. The two-day training was conducted by the authors of manual, Dr. Amra Delić, the neuropsychiatric and psychotherapist, long-time activist in the fields of human rights and volunteerism and Džejna Bajramović, B.Sc. a successful manager with a long career in leadership positions. Participants were students and young people from various non-governmental organizations and political BH parties.



Activity 2 Two-day training “Personal and Professional Development” in Tuzla

A two-day training “Personal and Professional Development” within the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education (ICDE) implemented by TPO Foundation Sarajevo was held in Tuzla on November 7-8, 2015 and it was organized by the Union of Students at the University of



Tuzla and TPO Foundation, Sarajevo. Students of the Faculty of Medicine and Faculty of Philosophy (University of Tuzla) attended the training and the training lecturers were Ms. Amra Delić, PhD and Ms. Džejna Bajramović, the executive marketing manager at the Tobacco Factory Sarajevo. The assistants were Irma Ramić in front of the Union of Students at the University of Tuzla and Anja Maksić in front of TPO Foundation Sarajevo. It was an opportunity to learn

how to write a proper and impressive CV, how to be successful and employable as well as the exploring of terminology that could be helpful in building our personality and ourselves in general. The participants got the handbook “Personal and Professional Development” whose authors were the lecturers Delić and Bajramović, so they could educate and build themselves further.

X CREATIVE WORKSHOPS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE AND PROMOTION OF THE COMIC BOOK NIRA 2



Activity 1 Promotion of the Comic book “Nira 2” and workshop in Zenica

TPO Foundation, Sarajevo implemented a workshop for thirteen (13) young people, with the promotion of the comic book “Nira” on September 17, 2015. The participants of this workshop were students from the First Gymnasium in Zenica.



Activity 2 Promotion of the Comic book “Nira 2” and workshop in Travnik

TPO Foundation Sarajevo has implemented a workshop for twenty three (23) participants in the elementary school “Kalibunar” within the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education (ICDE) on September 18, 2015. The participants of the workshop were pupils of 8th and 9th grade of the elementary school.



Activity 3 Promotion of the Comic book “Nira 2” and workshop in Visoko

TPO Foundation Sarajevo implemented a workshop for twenty (20) young people and promoted a comic book “Nira 2” in the Gymnasium “Visoko” in Visoko on September 22, 2015. A workshop was implemented within the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education (ICDE) for students of first and second grade of the secondary school.



Activity 4 Promotion of the Comic book “Nira 2” and workshop in Željezno Polje

TPO Foundation organized and implemented a workshop within the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education (ICDE). The workshop was implemented in the elementary school “Abdulvehab Ilhamija” in Željezno Polje on October 12, 2015. Fifteen (15) pupils who participated in the workshop were members of the art club.



Activity 5 Promotion of the Comic book “Nira 2” and workshop in Srebrenik

Within the project the Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education (ICDE), TPO Foundation implemented a workshop for seventeen (17) pupils in the High School “Srebrenik” in Srebrenik on October 28, 2015. The workshop was held in a high school library with the help and support of a school librarian, Željka Banović.



Activity 6 Promotion of the Comic book “Nira 2” and workshop in Živinice

On October 28, 2015 TPO Foundation implemented a workshop for eighteen (18) young people from the Gymnasium Živinice, within the project Initiative for Creative Dialogue and Education” (ICDE).



XI IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECT “MY BUSINESS IDEA, MY CHANCE” IN ORAŠJE



TPO Foundation Sarajevo, within the framework of the project “The Economic Stability of Women As a Contribution to Peace Building in the Community”, held its first two-day training on entrepreneurship for women in Northern Bosnia on October 9 - 10, 2015 in Orašje. The second two-day training was held on October 24 - 25, 2015 and the third training was held on

November 6 - 7, 2015. At the end of the second day of the third training, on November 7, 2015 the training was attended by all participants from the previous three trainings. On the final lecture, all participants presented the final version of their business proposals and their thoughts on how to build a network with other women from different ethnic groups. One of the youngest participants of the project offered free legal services to all project participants, as well as all the necessary legal information related to the registration of their business.



The trainings was done so as to educate women to prepare their own business plan and to support financially the best business ideas of women from three municipalities: Orašje, Domaljevac-Šamac and Donji Žabari. The added value of this project is that women from these three municipalities will work together on entrepreneurial ideas and thus deepen personal cooperation as well as the development of their local communities.

The training was conducted by dr. Zilka Spahić-Šiljak, a program director of TPO Foundation and Aida Zubčević, a director of “Faveda” Bosnia and Herzegovina and the president of the women entrepreneurs association in B&H “One”. With the support of the local coordinators of the project for this area, Eldina Kukuljević and Mandica Živković, the women with different ideas, motivation, desire and willingness to learn and improve were identified.



On this two-day training, participants had the opportunity to go through the basic elements of a business plan and learn from the positive experience from Bosnia and Herzegovina. Women are encouraged to take advantage of both their experiences in the work, and the potential of the project to realize the benefits of the cooperation provided to them in the creation of new business ideas. TPO Foundation will, in cooperation with entrepreneurs from Bosnia and

Herzegovina, provide mentoring during the preparation and implementation of business plans, which is very important support in the first steps of business development. What is particularly emphasized is the connection of women from three ethnic communities through economic cooperation and peace building in the community, because of these women is expected that in the coming months actively participate in peacekeeping activities in their local communities and municipalities.

XII 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM AGAINST GENDER BASED VIOLENCE



WHAT ARE YOU WAITING FOR?

On December 2015, on the occasion of the international campaign “16 Days of Activism against Gender Based Violence“, TPO Foundation organized traditionally a string of activities with purpose of awareness raising against gender based violence. This year’s campaign motto was “What Are You Waiting For?“, i.e. why we do not cease silence and waiting when it comes to violence. A kaleidoscope of workshops, promotions and expositions was realized in cooperation with faculties in Sarajevo, Zenica and Tuzla, and in primary and secondary schools in Živinice, Srebrenik, Podlugovi, Maglaj and Novi Šeher. On the workshops, children and young people had an opportunity to learn what violence is and what it implies, as well as about its forms of manifestation and what we can do, i.e. how to have a zero tolerance for gender based violence and violence in general. Activist panels were set up in the partner schools where students wrote their opinion or ways how to contribute to lessening of gender based violence. Promotion of the book “Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?“ edited by Monja Šuta-

Hibert was organized at the abovementioned faculties. A collection of essays on deeply rooted gender stereotypes, prejudice on feminism and position of women in bh society can be found in this very book. The performance “Cut” in cooperation with actresses of the Academy of Performing Arts Sarajevo was also a part of this year campaign and it presented the emotional state of violence victim through the body language. On the occasion of the International Day of Human Rights the promotion of the second edition of the comic “Nira” and collection of short stories “Nira’s Challenges” was held in the Jewish Community Centre, as well as the award ceremony for the best comics that emerged from TPO Foundation’s contest “Comic Up the Violence!”.

Activity 1 Promotion of the publication “Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?“ Sarajevo

TPO Foundation, Sarajevo organized the promotion of the publication “Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?“ The promotion was organized in cooperation with the Faculty of Political Sciences in Sarajevo. The promotion was held at the Faculty of Political Sciences in Sarajevo on 26.11.2015 at 12 pm within the international campaign “16 Days of Activism against Gender

Based Violence". The publication "Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?" is a collection of essays, comments and sketches related to the issue of gender equality in different areas of our society. Also, the publication talks about prejudices about feminism and the position of women in the contemporary society in Bosnia and Herzegovina.



Activity 2 Workshop "What Are You Waiting For?" in Srebrenik

On November 27, 2015 a workshop "What Are You Waiting For?" was held in Srebrenik within the international campaign "16 Days of Activism against Gender Based Violence". Sixteen (16) young people had an opportunity to find out what violence implied and how to have zero tolerance for it.



Activity 3 Workshop "What Are You Waiting For?" in Živinice

On November 30, 2015 "What Are You Waiting For?" workshop was held in Živinice Gymnasium within the international campaign "16 Days of Activism against Gender Based Violence". Twenty two (22) students of the above mentioned school attended the workshop and they had an opportunity to learn and to discuss the distinction between the sex and gender and through the segments of the psycho-drama they could put themselves in violence victim's shoes and feel the trials victims of violence were faced with (shame, lack of understanding and non-acceptance of the surroundings, fear, non sufficient support, etc.).



Activity 4 Promotion of the publication “Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?” in Tuzla

On December 02, 2015 the promotion of the publication “Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?”, exposition of the comics from “Bogey FemiTeaching” edition and performance “Cut” were organized at the Faculty of Philosophy at the University of Tuzla within the international campaign “16 Days of Activism against Gender Based Violence”. The promoters were Professor Jasmina Husanović from the Faculty of Philosophy and Monja Šuta-Hibert, the editor of this publication.



Activity 5 Promotion of the publication “Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?” in Zenica

On December 01, 2015 the promotion of the publication “Gender Stereotypes: Sounds Familiar?”, exhibition of the comics from “Bogey FemiTeaching” edition and performance “Cut” were organized at the Faculty of Philosophy at the University of Zenica. The promoters were the Dean of the Faculty of Philosophy, Damir Kukić, PhD, who was also one of the reviewers, assistant professor Edisa Gazetić, Lamija Begagić, one of the co-authors of this publication. The whole occasion was opened with the performance “Cut” performed by the actresses of the Academy of Performing Arts in Sarajevo and they showed the emotional state of a violence victim through body language.



Activity 6 Workshop “What Are You Waiting For?” in Novi Šeher

On December 3, 2015 in the Elementary School “Novi Šeher” in Novi Šeher, “What Are You Waiting For?” workshop was held. Eighteen (18) students of the above mentioned school attended the workshop and they had an opportunity to learn what violence implied, how to have zero tolerance for it and they got an insight into the links for further exploration and education.



Activity 7 Workshop “What Are You Waiting For?” in Podlugovi

On December 1, 2015 at the Elementary School “Podlugovi” in Podlugovi sixteen (16) pupils had the opportunity to participate at creative end educational workshop “What Are You Waiting For?”.



Activity 8 Workshop “What Are You Waiting For?” in the International High School, Sarajevo

On December 7, 2015 at the International High School, Sarajevo “What Are You Waiting For?” workshop was held for fifteen (15) students. The workshop was ended appositely with students' messages beginning with: “I will stop the silence and waiting by...” “What Are You Waiting For?” is this year's motto of the campaign implemented by TPO Foundation within the international campaign “16 Days of Activism against Gender Based Violence” with the aim of raising awareness on treating gender based violence and violence in general as a relevant social problem.



Activity 9 Workshop “What Are You Waiting For?” in the First Bosniak Gymnasium, Sarajevo

On December 8, 2015 at the First Bosniak Gymnasium, Sarajevo “What Are You Waiting For?” workshop was held for twenty (20) students of the above mentioned school.



Activity 10 Workshop “What Are You Waiting For?” in Secondary Medical school “Jezero” in Sarajevo

On December 9, 2015 in the PI Secondary Medical School “Jezero” in Sarajevo “What Are You Waiting For?” workshop was held for fourteen (14) students of the above mentioned school.



Activity 11 THE INTERNATIONAL DAY OF HUMAN RIGHTS



Every year TPO Foundation organizes a key event on the International Day of Human Rights to celebrate positive achievements, to promote successful work and to award the best work. On December 10, 2015 in the Jewish community, that provided premises for this event in the old Sarajevo, TPO

organized the gathering of students, teachers, parents and human rights activists.

First activity on this day was the promotion of the collection of short stories “Nira's Challenges” and the second edition of the comic book “Nira”. Pavle Kaunitz and Elma Softić-Kaunitz, Ferida Duraković, one of the reviewers presented the collection of short stories “Nira’s Challenges” and Monja Šuta-Hibert moderated the discussion. Ferida Duraković, a prominent B&H poetess concluded that this kind of literature is not ground-breaking literature that takes one’s breath, but it can be very useful for teachers in schools to enrich their methodological approaches. They all reflected on righteous, brave and emphatic Nira that can serve as a mirror to youth to get engaged.

Second activity during this event was the exhibition of the comics from the competition “Comic Up the Violence!” and announcement of winners was also a part of this ceremony. The speakers and the members of the selection committee Neven Misaljević, Pavle Kaunitz and Elma Softić-Kaunitz, commented on the drawings and how hard was to select among 70 comics that arrived to TPO from entire B&H. They also emphasized that most of the stories on the youth drawings came from the real life and present genuine personal experiences that which tells us about huge trauma and violence in B&H society.

In the end, the committee announced the best five comic drawings from the competition “Comic Up the Violence!” followed. The winners are as follows:



Docentica Lejla Mušić kazala je da koristeći se esejskim pristupom, stripovnim prikazom, diskusijom i analizom, te osvrtno na statističke podatke, ova publika-

XIV RESEARCH ON GENDER AND LEADERSHIP

TPO Foundation's work is underpinned by its research and academic activities that help us to pursue collaboration between academia and civil sector. An important activity this year was research on gender and leadership in business and politics conducted by professor Zilka Spahić Šiljak, and her colleagues: professor Dževad Šehić from the School of Economics in Sarajevo, and Suada Penava from Sarajevo. Three research assistants helped with conducting interviews and preliminary analysis: Melika Šahinović, Slađana Milin and Saida Mustajbegović.

The research was designed under the auspices of Stanford University and the supervision of professor Myra Strober and Katheryne Jolluck. Letter of invitations for interviews were sent to politicians from B&H and entity parliaments and some answered and accepted interviews via email and phone call while many of them had to be contacted via private connections. Managers were more professional and all answered via emails or phone calls and accepted to provide names of their co-workers for the standardized MLQ questionnaire. Two third of the political leaders did not want to provide the names for MLQ questionnaire because they were afraid of what their co-workers could tell about them and their work. All interviews were recorded, transcribed and analyzed and the final report was written.

XV CONFERENCE “TRAUMA, MEMORY AND HEALING ON THE BALKANS AND BEYOND”

TPO Foundation, together with its partners has developed and held a couple of meetings on the occasion for the conference “Trauma, Memory and Healing in the Balkans and beyond”, which is planned to be realized in the middle of next year. During 2015, we worked on the planning and organization of the conference, as well as collecting the materials necessary for the presentation of the theme that, in today's BH society, is one of the under-presented problems and society is not sufficiently favorable nor has implemented the necessary activities aimed at the treatment and prevention of trauma and ways of healing the individuals and communities in Bosnia and Herzegovina and beyond.

The conference will be held on 12-14 July 2016, which aims to create an interdisciplinary archive of knowledge and opportunities for treatment of memories and trauma in the Balkans and beyond. In a region that has experienced excessive violence during three wars in the last century, trauma scars are deep and overlapping. Multiple memories are not simple stories of suffering but through contestable victimization narratives play an important role in the socio-political programs. From a historical perspective, the experience of pain and great loss affecting all parties to the armed conflict and repressive regimes, it is clear that the entire community bear the overall impact of trauma in their anatomy and psyche, which requires recognition and healing.

XVI SUMMER SCHOOL 2016 – DEMYTHOLOGIZING NATIONS AND IDENTITIES: BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA’S MEDIEVAL PAST IN A EUROPEAN CONTEXT

During 2015, TPO Foundation began another in series of activities with the Faculty of Philosophy, University of Zenica. This time the partnership was realized together with the University of Regensburg. The aim of cooperation is the realization of the summer school which is planned for the next year. The program aims to stimulate reflection on how the medieval myths of identity and belonging to influence the contemporary discourse of nation and national identity. TPO Foundation and its partners held several meetings in order to define the activities and agenda of the summer school and the organization of participants and speakers at the summer school. All participants agreed that the presentation of new archival material seeks to demythologize aspects of Bosnian historiography, which presents a problem for the construction of peace and the establishment of a more inclusive education system. In this way, the planned program will interrogate the current revision of historiography in Bosnia and Herzegovina and the former Yugoslavia.

Summer school will be closely linked to the international conference “Trauma, Memory, Healing in the Balkans and Beyond” to be held in Sarajevo on 12 - 14 July, 2016. The conference deals with the issue of direct long-term legacy of violence and its impact on the establishment of peace. In the spirit of that, the Summer School will deal with the historical period that is of vital importance for our country and the entire region, especially if we take into account the importance that the medieval period was the revival of national myths and identity.
